Innerwick

PDS POSTAL SCAM

Royal Mail & The Trading Standards Office are making people aware of the following scam: A card posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a Premium rate number). If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £315 for the phone call. Please be aware that the premium rate number may change but nevertheless please DO NOT call any number stated on a card from PDS. Please make all your family, friends and neighbours aware of the above.

WIND TURBINES UPDATE

Aikengall II Wester Dodd, comprising 19 turbines is now under construction and is due to be commissioned July 2016. During this time residents of Innerwick, Oldhamstocks and Thurston should expect disruption to the road network. The Aikengall IIa proposed extension has been reduced from 27 to 19 turbines following a number of objections to the Scottish Govt including representations from ELCC and the local council authorities of East Lothian and the Borders. The revised proposal will be issued shortly followed by a 28 day consultation period. Representations should be made to East Lothian Council by January 31st 2015.

The proposed extension to Crystal Rig, Crystal Rig III comprising 6 turbines is currently going through planning while the scoping report for Phase IV, comprising 26 turbines has been submitted to the Scottish Government.

Two 70m high turbines have been erected at Ferneylea farm.

SPOTLIGHT ON INNERWICK PARISH

Innerwick parish extends from the coast at Thorntonloch and Skateraw in to the high ground of the Lammermuirs. The parish is about 10 miles in length and 2-3 miles in depth and covers some 8802 acres. The parish has 2 sites of special scientific interest: the steep valleys and diverse habitats of the East Lammermuir Deans and the woodland at Woodhall Dean, which is of value for its lichens.



Innerwick Castle lies 3 miles east of the village on a rocky promontory. The present ruin dates back to the 1400's and was captured and destroyed by Edward Seymour, Duke of Somerset in 1548. A large number of the buildings in Innerwick are listed as having architectural or historical importance. The old primary school and Parish Church all date from around 1784. Immediately post World War II. Innerwick had no mains electricity and no gas. By around 1950 electricity had arrived in the village, where before the village had depended on 12 oil lamps. Fast forward 40 years and Innerwick entered the nuclear age with the commissioning in 1988 of Torness. Innerwick, the largest of the four villages, maintains a strong sense of community and village tradition. The oldest event in the

village is probably the village flower show, which was established in 1873. The Parish Welfare Association was set up to provide trustees for the hall, which was built in 1909, and the park.

MAIN ISSUES REPORT

The Main Issues Report is a consultation document setting out potential options for development strategy and locations in East Lothian. The MIR is available online at www.eastlothian.gov.uk/ldp and is available at Planning reception at John Muir House. Haddington and public libraries. In East Lammermuir, sites in Innerwick, Spott and Stenton have been suggested for potential housing development. ELCC advises concerned residents to look carefully at the Dunbar area section of the MIR and make appropriate comment. Representations to the MIR should be made via the Council's Consultation Hub: www.eastlothianconsultations.co.uk. comments need to be made by Sunday 8th February 2015.

Local residents may express their feelings about the MIR and/or Windfarm developments to their local community councillors, as well as responding direct to the Council/Scottish Govt.

CRYSTAL RIG COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

The closing date for applications for the next round of funding from the Crystal Rig Community Benefit Fund is 24th April. At a recent meeting a total of £89,517 was awarded. The following organisations were successful in obtaining funding:

The Parish of Dunglass also received funding. Application forms and further information are from FLCC www.eastlammermuircommunitycouncil.org.uk or from ELCC representatives. Electronic submissions are preferred if possible. Applications are encouraged for projects, which bring residents of the communities of the 4

villages together.


