The Old Clubhouse at Stenton Bowling Club

Thanks to a grant from the Crystal Rig Benefit Fund, we at Stenton BC have been able to renovate our old clubhouse. The first



clubhouse was built in 1884 but was subsequently blown down in the winter gales of 1903. The present building was built two years later to replace it and is now the only one extant of its kind in East Lothian, a free-standing wooden structure with the

original gas lamps. The members have done all the external painting and the grant has allowed us to replace the roof and the four wooden pillars at the front. We can now use the interior for a changing area and are collecting some historic photos to go on display inside. We are very grateful to ELCC and the Crystal Rig Benefit Fund for their financial help.

POLICE REPORT

SPOTLIGHT ON OLDHAMSTOCKS PARISH

Oldhamstocks is the most southerly of East Lothians parishes, stretching 7 miles inland, gradually ascending from sea level into the Lammermuirs. Barely 2-3 miles in breadth. enclosing around 5775 acres, it has an unusual dogleg shape as it follows the border with neighbouring Berwickshire to the southeast. Bisected by the A1 road and east coast railway, its former castle (of Dunglass) was the first resting place for James VI as he headed south for London in 1603 to claim the throne.



Oldhamstocks Fair 1796 by Alexander Carse

The village of Oldhamstocks (Auldhamestocks - old dwelling place) is a picture perfect village with its white washed church and red pantiled cottages surrounding the village green and mercat cross. Grouped around the green are the former school & schoolhouse, the parish church & its manse, and a stone well. The village smithy remains at the East end and the corn mill, now a house, is down by the burn. The site of the former inn where Cromwell stayed is still to be seen on the south side of the village. Dating from 1701 the present church is on the former site of numerous earlier places of worship. The mercat cross and wellhead were the focal point of village life and this was painted in 1796 by the Scottish artist Alexander Carse when he portrayed the local fair. Farmlands surround the village as they

always have done, but it is far from being the lively market town it was for nearly 200 years; in 2000 there were no longer shops here or in any part of the parish.


