Introduction

This Survey Report Summary outlines the findings of the East Lammermuir Community Council's questionnaire.


Thanks to everyone who helped put the questionnaire together, and who took the time to answer the questions.

The questionnaire was live through Autumn 2023. The results form part of the evidence base for the East Lammermuir Place Plan.

To preserve individual anonymity, this summary does not include answers which were typed in, and does not report the exhaustive analysis of the survey.

However every comment, desire and concern is informing the Local Place Plan.

This report has been prepared on behalf of the East Lammermuir Community Council [ELCC] by Sarah McLeary of Smith Scott Mullan Associates.



Questionnaire

Local Community Councils in Dunbar and (separately) Dunpender had prepared questionnaires for their local populations to inform their own local place plans. These were generously shared as editable documents, and members of the community council with other local volunteers with relevant experience amended the Dunpender questionnaire to fit the needs of East Lammermuir.


Content was signed off by the ELCC prior to going live on line using an interactive document, and printed copies were placed in each of the four village halls for people who prefer that means of responding.

85 no. questionnaires have been completed and recorded.

The survey results note a range of views from the community, which broadly align with the detailed concerns we heard from the in-person consultation events.

A number of detailed actions for maintenance and safety around specific streets and roads has been noted, and will be collated into an overarching strategy.

The views and comments from the questionnaire will be analysed in more detail on the following pages.



Survey Results

The survey was completed online and on paper by 85 respondents from across East Lammermuir, we thank all for the careful thought they put into their valuable responses.

Redacted, anonymised information has been analysed and forms part of a strong evidence base.

The survey asked questions about

- · desired changes,
- sustainability and climate change,
- renewable energy production,
- the green energy infrastructure process.
- · health and social care,
- play and community facilities,
- shops and local businesses,
- tourism,
- housing needs today and in the future,
- · landscape and open space,
- movement and access,
- walking and cycling

We received responses from a representative selection across the areas in East Lammermuir, and are able to view responses by area, which is helpful to analyse the particular concerns of an area.


The spread of respondent age skews towards the older demographic, as we expect for a survey of this type and the demographic spread of the area generally.

The Community Council reached out to schools in order to redress this balance.


Overall, we see the results of the consultation as representative of the concerns and aspirations of the community as a whole.


Survey Summary

The survey asked about desired changes.


These desires have been collated and categorised by theme, to create a snapshot of the changes that people want to make.

The comments themselves are redacted in this summary.


















Do you own or run a local business?




How easy is it to find employment, receive training or learn new skills locally? Please tick one option.






What type of accommodation do you live in...





